

## Khaled Al kuwaildi Home Bombed

Dear Sir:

These are photographs taken by myself, Kate Caughall, in Sorman City near Sabratha Libya. This home was bombed by NATO at about 2:30AM Monday the 20th of June 2011. The family name was Al Khwaildy. So far there are 15 dead, including 3 missing people. One baby, one pregnant woman, children, women, young and old men. The Dr. told us that there were 3 women sent to Tripoli with severe injuries and are not expected to live, there are 2 in intensive care at the Sabratha Hospital, one young boy (in the photos) and one woman who lost her leg (in the photos).

Mr. Al Khwaildy was 75 years old, he had brain surgery 4 years ago and they said he was never right after that, all he as able to do was some small amount of farming. Any claim that he was involved in any way with any government is stale dated by at least 50 months.

We witnessed that this was a family home, we saw no evidence in the home area or in the outside area of any type of military presence. The family had a tennis court that was bombed twice, a small park with some animals, many injured and killed. We saw a small dental clinic outside near the farm that was very damaged. There was a large Mosque next door and across the street from the Mosque was a post office and small shopping area with some apartments. This area was hit and destroyed killing 3 people from the Sudan. There are some photos included.

This was a "direct hit" they call a laser strike. It was very precise, it was a laser marked target. The Libyan police arrested 3 men minutes after the strike that were in possession of laser devices (like laser pointers). The police in this small town do not know what they are or how they could be used. Let the military experts make that determination. There is no way this was an accident, it was a planned event. I have witnessed this atrocity, my husband has witnessed this atrocity - the people at this place begged us to show these photos to the outside world.

Please be aware there are some graphic photos of the dead people included, they insisted that we go take photos so that we can send them to America and the world. I am not a reporter, I am not a doctor, neither is my husband, we are civilians in Libyan on a peace and fact finding mission. I would never ever go to a morgue and look at dead bodies, this was very difficult for us. What I witnessed yesterday will stay with me forever.
